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PREFACE

We express our gratitude to the presence of Allah SWT, the Almighty God, because with His grace and guidance the Accreditation Council for Education (ACE) was able to complete the Book 2 document, namely the Self-Evaluation Report (*LED*) for the Doctoral Program (S3), which is part of the Study Program Accreditation Instrument (*IAPS*). *IAPS* was prepared to respond to the Regulation of the National Accreditation Agency of Higher Education (*BAN-PT*) No. 9 of 2020, dated October 22, 2020, concerning the Policy for Transferring Study Program Accreditation from *BAN-PT* to *LAM*.

This LED consists of three parts, namely the Faculty Profile, Criteria, and Analysis of Problems and the Study Program Development. The Faculty profile contains seven aspects, namely (1) identity; (2) vision, mission, goals, and strategies for achieving them (*VMTS*); (3) lecturers; (4) students; (5) finance; (6) Internal Quality Assurance System (IQA System); and (7) the level of competitiveness of the Faculty. The criteria consist of nine aspects, namely (1) vision, mission, objectives, and strategies; (2) governance, management, and partnership; (3) students; (4) human resources; (5) finance, facilities, and infrastructure; (6) education; (7) research; (8) outreach; and (9) Teaching-Research-Outreach output and achievements. Analysis of Study Program Problems and Development is divided into two groups, namely (1) evaluation of Study Program performance achievements and (2) Study Program development programs.

Each Criterion (Section B) is elaborated into four aspects, namely (1) policy, which is a standard set by the Government and Universities, (2) implementation, (3) evaluation, and (4) follow-up action. The Evaluation Aspect answers questions, such as "Have the Faculty and the Study Program been able to achieve the set standards?". "If so, how well or how high have the Faculty and the Study Program achieved these standards?". "If not, what factors have caused the Faculty and the Study Program not to be able to achieve these standards?". The Follow-up Action aspect explains the steps taken so that the Faculty and the Study Program are able to achieve or exceed the established standards. Thus, efforts to continuously improve quality in order to build a quality culture can be realized.


